Excellent Results for Davitt College Students in Junior Certificate 2017

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“We are delighted today with all of our Junior Certificate students’ results and I want to congratulate each and every one of them and their teachers. All of the hard work has paid off and there is great excitement here in Davitt College today!!”, said a very happy school principal Bernie Rowland. “There were 125 students sitting the Junior Certificate in Davitt College this year, an increase on last year of just over 20%. This year we have the dual presentation of marks. English is the first subject to be rolled out under the new Junior Cycle reforms and the results being presented for English this year are based on the new assessment and grading system. So instead of the traditional grades, such as As, Bs, Cs, and so forth, students were graded using terms such as “distinction”, “higher merit”, “merit”, “achievement”, in English. For example almost 80% of our students received results between Distinction, Higher Merit and Merit this year, with the remainder achieving their full potential.” All other subjects then, except English, were graded in the traditional way, As, Bs, Cs, etc. “Congratulations to all students receiving their Junior Certificate results today”, said Bernie Rowland. “I would urge all boys and girls celebrating their results to celebrate carefully and sensibly, enjoy your success and refrain from drinking alcohol and above all get home safely,”

A number of Leaving Certificate students of 2017 at Davitt College, Castlebar dropped in to their school recently to say goodbye and thank teachers and staff for their six years of post-primary education. These young men and women are embarking on Third Level courses in universities and training colleges throughout Ireland for the academic year 2017/2018. They are spreading their wings to all four provinces of Ireland – from Trinity College Dublin to University of Limerick to N.U.I. Galway.

“There is definitely a trend towards the STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths) this year,” said Bernie Rowland, Davitt College principal. “We offer all four science subjects at Senior Level, Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Agricultural Science.” “There has been a steady increase in the uptake of these subjects over the past two/three years and this is evident when you consider the degree programmes students are choosing at Third Level,” she said. Another popular choice has been in the Business Courses. “Davitt College offers Business, Economics and Accounting to Leaving Certificate level which definitely gives our students a broad business knowledge”.

CSI Comes to Davitt College!

On October 11th 2017, Transition Year students of Davitt College participated in the fourth annual Forensic Science Workshop at Davitt College. The aim of these workshops is to bring classroom science into real-life situations and get more students interested in continuing to study science for Third Level education. The activities provided the students with an exciting opportunity to experience an everyday use of Science in a real world situation. It proved to be an exciting and interactive educational experience, where observation and deductive reasoning combined with the science that students are learning in Davitt College, and are used to solve crimes in the real world.

As part of the workshop, students were presented with a real crime and given all the appropriate information to solve it, such as suspect information; where they were and what they were doing at the time of the crime, their occupations and evidence such as fingerprints. Students then went from station to station trying to match pieces of evidence to each suspect to help solve the crime. Each station had a different topic such as ballistics, where students had to study the amount of GSR (Gun Shot Residue) left on the clothing of each suspect.

The students of Davitt College thoroughly enjoyed being put through the analytical stages and having to actively bring their learning to life. This is just a sample of the showcases that the Science Department do each year, with the BT Young Scientist Competition being a pivotal part of the Transition Year Programme.


- Mental Health & Concern Debates
